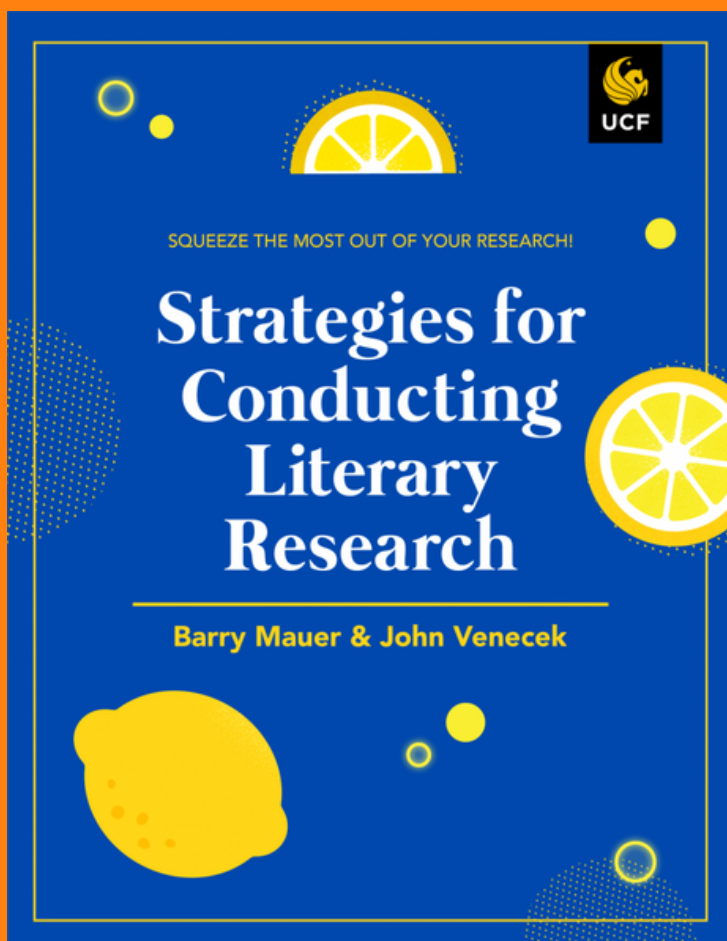

### Import Content into Your Course

**IT'S EASY!**

To import contents, start within your own webcourse.

- From your homepage, click "Settings" in the left navigation menu ("Settings" is the last item).
- From the right menu, click the fifth item down: "Import Course Content."
- In the "Content Type" dropdown menu, select "Copy a Canvas Course."
- In the "Search for a Course" dropdown menu, locate "Strategies for Conducting Literary Research."

### Importing, Continued

**YOU'RE ALMOST THERE!**

- Under "Content," change setting from "All content" to "Select specific content." Click "Import." Strategies for Conducting Literary Research will appear under "Current Jobs."
- Click the "Select Content" button to the right of the top item. Select any or all of the materials EXCEPT "Course Settings" & "Syllabus Body" (if you select those items, they will overwrite the homepage and settings in your host course).
- Click "Select Content" button. Done!

### Customize and Modify the Contents

**USE ONLY WHAT YOU NEED**

To customize, delete any materials you don't need. Make materials optional or required. Assign due dates and points to discussions, quizzes, and the "Foundational Materials" assignment (or leave them ungraded). Contact your instructional designer if you need help.
